## **CEHA Homeowner's Meeting**

Emmett Mercier opened the meeting at 7:08 PM. There were only five homeowners present and therefore was not a quorum present. Pat report that there is \$12,549.00 in the CEHA account. Emmett asked for a report from Beautification committee. The front is currently decorated for Mardi Gras. Bill stated that he would like to see the Christmas lights to stay up all year.

Susan reported that she is working to schedule an Easter egg hunt again in the subdivision. This would be held on the weekend prior to Easter, which is on April 4. There were no new architectural control requests from CEHA. Emmett reported on drainage.

Emmett reported that we have several covenant violations, which primarily include trailers in the driveways. Emmett also reported that the individual who had bought the Frampton's extra lot had taken some of the fencing down, which needs to be replaced. A letter will be sent to the homeowner to replace the missing fencing. Emmett also mentioned that covenant violators' names should be placed in the newsletter in order to get compliance with the covenants.

Emmett mentioned that the elections for officers will be in September and asked for the homeowners to consider serving as officers for CEHA. Art and Don won the door prizes. Emmett will select someone to bring the door prize for the next meeting.
